0630 Occupied all the vicinity of the place of attack and started unloading.

0700 3 large type enemy planes attacked, but ~~damaged~~ were repulsed.

1600 Several times 3 enemy planes made strafing attacks but were repulsed.

1900 Finished unloading. The war vessels escorting KATSURAGI MARU kept a strict ~~guard~~ watch.

5. 12 January 1942 to 15 January 1942.

The KEMA Unit pursued ~~the enemy~~ what was left of the enemy over difficult terrain and busied ~~itself~~ itself with the transportation of munitions.

6. 16 January 1942

The KEMA Unit joined forces with the Main Unit.

(c) The Medical Unit at once set up a station 50 meters north of the flying field and took care of the ~~the~~ casualties.

(d) The Paymaster Unit took over the duties of first aid and the supplying of provisions.

Leaving ~~the~~ Nicholas Airfield in Manila, took over the guard and preparation duties of the Davao and SASA Airfields.

3. 13 April.

0600 Enemy planes ~~xxxx~~ arrived and attacked with bombs. Collecting all forces was able to drive off the enemy.

4. 26 April. (Via transport planes) R

Left Davao Airfield and arriving at LANGOAN ~~the~~ joined forces with the Main Force.

(b) Bent all its energies to the carrying out of duties of aiding ~~unit~~ ~~servicing~~ and working with the different Air Units.

(c) On 26 January <sup>an</sup> ~~the~~ attack by enemy planes was frustrated by ~~their~~ its rifle and cannon fire.

2. 30 January to 11 February (Transport via plane)

Due to the plan of operations, was placed under the command of TSUKAHARA Unit and carried on operational communications (With Davao and Sasa airfields).

The Paratroop Unit during the two days of 20 and 21 February distracted the attention of the greater part of the Enemy forces to the east of ~~Kuban~~, so that the Army Unit which was landing and attacking from the West was greatly aided and their task was decisively facilitated and they were able to inflict great casualties on the enemy and ~~thus~~ this caused him to retreat so that on 23 February he surrendered unconditionally.

2. The Paratroop Unit after the <sup>fierce</sup> battle which took place at BABAU, passing through mountainous jungle paths by <sup>day</sup> night were able to occupy and secure the enemy Airfield.

3. The troops which landed in the face of the enemy together with the above Unit and the attacking Army forces forging through terribly miry terrain and fighting against considerable enemy resistance were able to occupy ~~KUBAN~~ Airfield with celerity.

4. Although it was extremely difficult to supply ammunition and food to the Paratroop Unit, the members of the supply Unit kept them regularly supplied each day and ably seconded their efforts.

As things began to be organized an airplane spotting station was put up at BRAIN(?) (About 30 kilometers east of ~~KUPAN~~) and a strict watch was kept for enemy planes. The defence of the territory was well organized and ably carried out.

These were treated as persons who were indulging in enemy activities and will be used henceforth on the stringing of telegraph wires and other such work, and their arrest has contributed vastly to the restoration of peace and safety.

9 April: The platoon ~~led~~ by Sergeant-Major HASHIZAWA was actively engaged in mopping up remaining enemies in and around TORAKABOA on the northern shore of the Bay of KOEPANG.

13 to 14 April:

1. Two squads of the 1st Company were engaged in searching for the crew of the enemy airplane which was shot down ~~there~~ on the Northeast shore of the Bay of KOEPANG.

2. One Platoon of the 2nd Company was actively engaged in mopping up the enemies remaining in the BROCK area as well as searched for small fires (Only at the time of enemy plane attacks are there unnoticed small fires), with no untoward results.

14 April: One platoon of the 2nd Company searched the vicinity of SEMAOE Island for an enemy plane which had been shot down.

2. A Platoon of the 2nd Company searched the BROCK area again to mop up remaining enemies and to discover small fires set by airplanes. No untoward results.

3. A platoon of the 1st Company again searched the Northeastern shore of KOEPANG Bay for an enemy plane that had been shot down and captured two of its crew. (in the vicinity of PARITE)

16 April: At a quarter past nine in the morning a demolition squad was sent to the TENAO area in order to construct defence works.

16 to 18 April: A portion of the 3rd Company was dispatched to the northern shore of KOEPANG Bay, in the PANTEBROEK ~~XXX~~ area to clean out the area and to search for an Australian Air Force Captain as well as a Lieutenant who had been reported to have been part of the crew of an enemy plane which was downed there ~~there~~.

27 April to 2 May: Two Platoons of the 3rd Company were dispatched to BESIKAWA (On the Southern shore of Timor Island, about 160 kilometers ~~northeast~~ from KOEPANG) to mop up remaining enemies and to look for an enemy plane which had been shot down, as well as to extend help to the crew of one of our planes which was overdue; and captured two enemy soldiers.

2 to 6 May: Two platoons of the 2nd Company were dispatched to ROTI Island in order to put down a rebellion, ~~there~~.

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22 to 23 May: About one company under the orders of the Commanding Officer was dispatched to the area comprising the south shore of the Western part of the Island of Timor (West of MINA river and between it and the village of TERESU) to clean out all remaining enemies and to conduct an examination of the ~~place~~ area.

27 May: At 1 o'clock in the afternoon, due to the incendiaryism of the enemy minded natives, a large fire broke out to the west of the Airfield and ~~was~~ put out thanks to the efforts of the Airfield Guard Unit.
